Government departments, municipalities, and other public bodies continue to receive high volumes of requests. Individuals make the majority of access requests, with over 64 percent of the 3,695 requests submitted. This marks an increase of 20.6 percent in total requests from the previous year. These requests are generally fulfilled free of charge, enhancing government transparency and accountability.

As a government, we are dedicated to transforming the access to information and privacy landscape by adopting an integrated approach that promotes accountability, consistency, and transparency. The Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Office oversees the implementation and coordination of ATIPPA, 2015, providing oversight, support and guidance to public bodies.

In recognition of the increased demands on municipalities related to access to information requests and privacy protection, we are enhancing support by increasing the ATIPPO Office's capacity to provide assistance.

I thank the access and privacy professionals for your unwavering dedication, diligence, and integrity in upholding the principles of transparency and privacy protection. Your work ensures that transparency is not just a value, but a practice. Your hard work and commitment ensure that our citizens' rights are safeguarded, and their personal information is handled with the utmost care and respect.

## Overview

ATIPPA, 2015 sets out how public bodies in Newfoundland and Labrador must respond to access to information requests, and how they must protect personal information. The role of the ATIPP Office is to assist these public bodies in complying with the legislation, and to monitor performance as outlined in this report.

Public bodies include government departments, agencies, boards, commissions, Crown corporations, health authorities, educational bodies and municipalities.

### **Providing Assistance**

The ATIPP Office provides support for public bodies by:

- operating a help line for public bodies, members of the public, and anyone who has questions about access to information and protection of privacy;
- developing training materials and delivering training sessions for ATIPP coordinators, municipalities, and other public body employees;
- delivering Communities of Practice sessions which are available to ATIPP coordinators across the province;
- developing and maintaining policy manuals on access and privacy;
- developing guidance on specific issues including municipal access and privacy, handling privacy breaches, and information protection; and
- conducting privacy assessments on new and existing programs and services.


### **Monitoring Access and Privacy**

The ATIPP Office also monitors how well public bodies are complying with ATIPPA, 2015. This role includes:

- maintaining statistics on access requests to departments and public bodies, including the outcome of requests, fees charged and response times; and
- monitoring privacy breaches that occur across government.

## Highlights of 2023-24



In the 2023-24 fiscal year, 3,695 requests were made to government departments and public bodies.

Throughout the year, the ATIPP Office has also supported ATIPP coordinators, public body staff and members of the public through our ATIPP Help Line, fielding over 2,275 calls/enquiries on a wide variety of access and privacy issues. During the 2023-24 fiscal year, the Office held 98 sessions including training, presentations, communities of practice, and monthly meetings for coordinators with over 1400 people attending.

The Office reviewed 69 privacy assessments of programs and services to assess privacy risks and recommend mitigation measures to ensure the protection of personal information and compliance with privacy requirements under the Act.


The ATIPP Office continued to facilitate enrolment in the University of Alberta Information Access and Protection of Privacy Certificate program for government department coordinators.

The ATIPP Office continues to proactively release completed general ATIPP requests through the Completed ATIPP Request website (<http://atipp-search.gov.nl.ca/>) which supports openness and transparency. General requests for government departments are posted on this website so the public can access information that has been disclosed through the access to information request process.

# Report on Performance

## Number of Requests Received

In the 2023-24 fiscal year, a total of 3,695 access requests were made to government departments and public bodies (see Annex A). Overall, there has been a 28% per cent increase in the number of access requests received by government departments and public bodies over a five-year period (2019-20 to 2023-24).



3,267 (88 per cent) were general requests for records relating to public body activities and programs.

During 2023-24, general requests represented most access to information requests received by all public bodies.

Of the 3,695 requests received in 2023-24, the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador received 2,033 (55 per cent) requests, while other public bodies received 1,662 (45 per cent) requests. Of the requests made to government departments and public bodies, 428 (12 per cent) were for personal information – people asking for their own information. The remaining

## Response Times to Access Requests

During the 2023-24 fiscal year:


- departments responded to 84 per cent of requests within the legislated timelines<sup>1</sup>; and
- public bodies responded to 89 per cent of requests within the legislated timelines<sup>2</sup>.

### Requests submitted by Applicant Type

Many different types of people make access to information requests each year. Applicants are divided into eight different categories: individuals, political parties, media, businesses, legal firms, interest groups, researchers and other public bodies.

Individuals, media and political parties made the largest number of requests in 2023-24.



## Processing Costs Paid for Access Requests

Cost can be charged for locating records after 15 free hours (or 10 free hours for a local government body).

Total costs of \$625 were paid in 2023-24.

**Figure 2 – Costs paid**





## Outcomes of Requests

Figure 3 shows the final outcome of requests made to departments and other public bodies in 2023-24. The majority resulted in partial disclosure (37 per cent) or full disclosure (30 per cent).

## ATIPP Office Support

The ATIPP Office assists government departments and public bodies understand their roles and responsibilities relating to access to information and the protection of privacy by providing advice and guidance and also responds to public enquiries.

## Privacy Assessments

Any new government programs must undergo a preliminary privacy impact assessment or a full privacy impact assessment to identify potential privacy risks and ensure compliance with the privacy provisions of the Act.

In 2023-24, the ATIPP Office reviewed 69 privacy assessments of new or existing programs and services to ensure the protection of personal information.

## Training

This fiscal year the ATIPP Office continued to provide various types of training, presentations, etc. for coordinators and public body employees.

In total, 1,445 people attended 98 different access and privacy training/sessions/presentations and 1,152 people completed the online access and privacy training offered through the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador's Centre for Learning and Development.

## Section B – Costs

Section 25 of the Act gives the Minister responsible for the Act the right to establish a Cost Schedule which outlines the applicable costs for access to information requests (the Cost Schedule can be found online at [www.gov.nl.ca/atipp](http://www.gov.nl.ca/atipp) ). There is no application fee; however, applicants can be charged \$25 per hour for locating records; 25 cents per page for photocopying; and associated shipping costs. For municipalities, fees are not charged for the first 10 hours of time spent locating records. For all other public bodies, fees are not charged for the first 15 hours of time spent locating records. The head of a public body may waive the requirement to pay any fees if payment would impose an unreasonable financial hardship on the applicant or is in the public interest. In 2023-24, a total of \$625 in costs were paid by applicants for access requests:

## Section C – Final Outcomes

Responding to requests can result in a range of possible outcomes. The outcome may be full or partial disclosure of information; the applicant may withdraw or abandon the request; the record may not exist or may already be available in the public domain; or access to the records may be denied. Partial disclosure means exceptions have been applied and some information has been redacted in accordance with the legislation.

Of the 309 requests received by public bodies, 162 (52 per cent) resulted in partial or full disclosure, access was denied in 92 (30 per cent) requests and 34 (11 per cent) were for information where there were no responsive records.

## Section D – Exceptions to Disclosure

One of the main purposes of the Act is to provide access to information subject only to specific and limited circumstances. Under the Act, certain types of information are exempt from disclosure to applicants. There are two categories of exceptions: mandatory exceptions, which departments and public bodies must apply; and discretionary exceptions, which departments and public bodies may exercise discretion to apply.

Since a single request may list more than one exception, the numbers noted in the tables below do not correlate to the total number of access requests received during the 2023-24 fiscal year. For example, one record or piece of information could be redacted as cabinet confidences (s.27), policy advice or recommendations (s.29) and information harmful to the financial or economic interests of a public body (s.35).

Of the 31 requests responded to by the House of Assembly and Statutory Offices, 19 (61 per cent) resulted in full or partial disclosure, seven (23 per cent) were for records that did not exist, and access was denied in three (10 per cent) requests.

## Exceptions to Disclosure

Since a single request may list more than one exception, the numbers noted in the tables below do not correlate to the total number of access requests received during the 2018-19 fiscal year. For example, one record or piece of information could be redacted as cabinet confidences (s.27), policy advice or recommendations (s.29) and information harmful to the financial or economic interests of a public body (s.35).

## Annex C – Systemic Issues Identified by OIPC

For their 2022-23 Annual report, the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner (OIPC) identified one systemic issue relating to the Act.

The identified issue centered on complaints against municipalities. Over the past year, there were 77 complaints made about 21 municipalities in Newfoundland and Labrador. A small number of municipalities were the focus of the majority of complaints, with one receiving 24.

The problems identified by the OIPC also included how some towns did not comply with the requirements outlined in the Act (e.g. responding to emails, etc. during investigations). Many small towns only have one person doing many jobs, meaning some simply do not have time or capacity to handle information requests as legislatively required.

Even though training is offered, it may be difficult for municipal staff to attend given competing priorities of importance to the community and residents. For other towns, the number of requests received are limited, meaning that they may not have the experience required to process a request when it is received.

Privacy complaints identified by the OIPC included town councils sharing personal information in public meetings or documents. Many access complaints related to legislative timelines being missed. The OIPC indicated that this often meant they had to step in to get a response.

The ATIPP Office provides support to municipalities, including providing 50 training sessions over the course of the year; however, it is acknowledged that more support tailored to the needs of towns is required. In most instances non-compliance with the Act was the result of limited resources which can contribute to an inability to keep up to date on legislative requirements. The Office is committed to working with towns to identify ways to better support them, including increasing resources within the Office.
