

Operating Area Name: FMD4 – Domestic Cutting Area	Operating Area #: 36, 90
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Description of Area:

Domestic Area 36 includes a portion of Forest Management District 4 starting at the Mint Brook Resource Road and ending at Triton Brook, managed through the Gambo District Office. Domestic Area 90 is located along the entire Eastern side of Terra Nova Lake and is managed by Gambo and Clarendville District Offices.

Harvesting Activities:

Cutting Conditions Applied to Area 36:

- . Crown domestic permits are issued for 23 m³/permit/year in FMD 4 – MINT BROOK.
- . Area 36 permits are issued for the harvesting of **DEAD AND BLOWDOWN wood only**
- . No harvesting of white pine or red pine (dead or alive).
- . Permittee not permitted to cut or damage immature timber.
- . Permittee not permitted to cut or damage silviculturally treated timber.

Cutting Conditions Applied to Area 90:

- . Crown domestic permits are issued for 16 m³/permit/year in FMD 4 – Eastern side TNL.
- . Permittee not permitted to cut or damage immature timber.
- . Permittee not permitted to cut or damage silviculturally treated timber.
- . No harvesting of white pine or red pine (dead or alive)

Non Timber Considerations and Mitigations:

A 30 meter buffer will be maintained on both sides of all rivers, brooks, ponds or other water bodies that are shown on 1:50,000 topographic maps.

On water bodies where an approved cabin development area exists, a 105 meter buffer must be maintained along the shoreline.

Where an approved license to occupy for a cabin exists, a 20 meter buffer is to be maintained.

No forestry activity is to occur within 800 meters of a bald eagle or osprey nest during the nesting season (Mar 15 to July 31) and 200 meters during the remainder of the year.
