**Regulatory Advice from Government Screening Departments/Divisions**

**1 Climate Change Branch (CCB), Department of Environment and Climate Change (ECC)**

- 1.1 Proponent is advised that the clearing of trees and brush can contribute to climate change. Where required, all clearing activities must be undertaken with appropriate permits through the Forestry Division. All heavy-duty equipment used in the construction and operating phase of this project should be operated in a manner to maximize fuel efficiency, thereby reducing greenhouse gas emissions that could contribute to climate change. **2 Water Resources Management Division (WRMD), ECC**

- 2.1 Prior to the start of construction, the Proponent must apply for and obtain a Water Use License.
- 2.2 Any effluent or runoff leaving the site will be required to conform to the requirements of the Environmental Control Water and Sewage Regulations. For further information, please contact the WRMD at (709) 729-2563.

**3 Government Service Centre (GSC), Department of Digital Government and Service NL (DGSNL)**

- 3.1 Any spill or leak of gasoline or associate product is to be reported immediately to Digital Government and Service NL by calling the Environmental Emergencies Telephone Line at 772-2083 or 1-800-563-9089. For further information, please contact the GSC at (709) 729-0248.

**4 Occupational Health and Safety (OHS), DGSNL**

- 4.1 Proponent must ensure all activities are conducted with compliance with the **Occupational Health and Safety Act** and Regulations. This includes the responsibility for ensuring that contractors hired to perform work also comply with this legislation, as per OHS Act section 10. **5 Department of Fisheries, Forestry and Agriculture (FFA)**

- 5.1 Proponent is advised to operate under established legislation and regulations, such as the **Wild Life Act** and Wild Life Regulations, to avoid or minimize adverse impacts.
- 5.2 The **Wild Life Act**, Wild Life Regulations, **Migratory Birds Convention Act**, and the Migratory Bird Regulations protect birds and prohibit the disturbance or destruction of bird nests and eggs in the province. For additional information visit:

- 5.3 A Cutting Permit is required prior to any harvesting or timber removal in the area.

## **6 Department of Industry, Energy and Technology (IET)**

- 6.1 Proponent is advised to notify Newfoundland Power of the Project. For further information, please contact the Mines Branch of IET at (709) 729-5748.

## **7 Department of Transportation and Infrastructure (TI)**

- 7.1 Proponent is not permitted to construct a separate access to Route 350 at any point in time without first seeking approval from the Department.
- 7.2 There shall be no encroachment on property or highways owned by TI without express written consent from the Deputy Minister. The Proponent is responsible to identify property and highways owned by TI. For further information, please contact TI at (709) 729 5399.
