**THE UNDERTAKING**

**(i) Purpose/Rational/Need for the Undertaking:**

To access remote cottage # 131634 from existing ATV trail

**DESCRIPTION OF THE UNDERTAKING:**

**(i) Geographical Location**

- Description of the proposed site:  
To leave existing trail and end at cottage #131634 the actual new trail construction is approximately .5 km.

**(ii) Physical Features:**

- Major physical features of the undertaking  
There are no man-made physical features along the proposed trail route
- **Areas to be affected by the undertaking:**  
Trail excavation will occur between the existing trail and remote cottage # 131634
- **A description of the physical and biological environment:**

The terrain along the trail consist of mostly barren 70%, wetland approximately 15%, wooded area approximately 15%. These points are indicated on the provided map. Two (2) wooden bridges measuring approximately 6' x 6' are required in wetland area to allow run-off due to spring thaw and heavy rain. There are no stream crossings.

**Construction:**

- **Approximate total construction period:**  
At estimated construction speed of 1 km per day, trail excavation will require approximately 1 day.
- **Proposed date of first physical construction-related activity on site:**  
April 2010
- **Potential sources of pollutants during the construction period:**  
Possible pollutants include air pollution from excavator diesel engine  
Possible water pollution from the oil and fuel used by the excavator.
- **Potential causes of resource conflicts:**  
There is no resource activity currently in process along the proposed trail route.

**(iii) Operation**

- **Description of the Operation:**  
Once the trail is complete it will allow access to remote cottage by walking or ATV.
- **Estimated period of operation:**  
The trail will be accessible year round
- **Potential sources of pollutants during operation periods:**  
Fuel or oil leaks from ATV's.
- **Potential causes of resource conflicts:**  
There are no industrial resource activities along the proposed trail route
