**Regulatory and Technical Advice from Government Departments/Divisions**

**EA #: 2347 Moosehead Lake Quarry Extension (the Project)**  
**Iron City Services Limited (the Proponent)**

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**1 Climate Change Branch (CCB), Department of Environment and Climate Change (ECC)**

- 1.1 Proponent is advised to consider provincial climate change projections for Wabush Lake (nearest regional site) in Project planning.
- 1.2 Proponent is advised that all heavy-duty equipment is to be operated in a manner that maximizes fuel efficiency, thereby reducing greenhouse gas emissions that could contribute to climate change. For further information, please contact the CCB at (709)729-1485.

**2 Pollution Prevention Division (PPD), ECC**

- 2.1 Proponent is advised that all waste material generated during the construction and operation of the quarry is to be placed in suitable refuse containers and removed to an approved waste disposal site.
- 2.2 on site shall be removed and disposed of at an approved waste disposal facility.

**3 Water Resources Management Division (WRMD), ECC**

- 3.1 Proponent is advised to apply for and obtain a Water Use Licence under the **Water Resources Act** prior to the start of construction.
- 3.2 Any effluent or runoff leaving the site will be required to conform to the requirements of the Environmental Control Water and Sewage Regulations. For further information, please contact WRMD at (709) 729-2563.

**4 Government Service Centre (GSC), Department of Government Modernization and Service Delivery (GMSD)**

- 4.1 Proponent is advised to maintain a valid Certificate of Approval issued by GMSD and comply with all conditions of that approval.
- 4.2 Proponent is advised to have spill response equipment readily available on-site to enable a quick and effective response to a spill event, and any spill or leak of Gasoline or associate product is to be reported immediately to GMSD by calling the Environmental Emergencies Telephone Line at 772-2083 or 1-800-563-9089.
- 4.3 A development permit is required from GMSD under the Protected Road Zoning Regulations for any construction within 400 metres of the centre line of Route 500.
- 4.4 A permit is required from GMSD in accordance with the **Urban and Rural Planning Act** for the construction, upgrade, or change of use of an access road in a protected area, or for any access onto a protected road. For further information, please contact the GSC – GMSD at (709) 729-0248.

## 5 Occupational Health and Safety (OHS), GMSD

- 5.1 Proponent is advised to ensure all activities are conducted in compliance with the **OHS Act** and Regulations. This includes the responsibility for ensuring that contractors hired to perform work also comply with this legislation, as per **OHS Act** section 10. ## 6 Department of Fisheries, Forestry and Agriculture (FFA)

- 6.1 Proponent is advised permission must be obtained from landowners if work is planned within issued title sites, including private lands that may not be recorded with the Crown Lands Office.
- 6.2 Proponent is advised to operate under the **Wild Life Act** and **Migratory Birds Convention Act** and associated regulations to avoid or minimize adverse impacts.
- 6.3 Proponent is advised that several species are currently being assessed for designation and listing under the Newfoundland and Labrador **Endangered Species Act (ESA)** and the federal **Species at Risk Act (SARA)**. The Proponent should be aware that if species that are designated and listed under endangered species legislation are found within the Project area, the **ESA** and/or the federal **SARA** will apply and the Proponent may be required to develop mitigations, in consultation with FFA-Wildlife Division, for the protection and recovery of the species. ## 7 Department of Industry, Energy and Technology (IET)

- 7.1 The Proponent is advised a quarry permit or a quarry lease under the **Quarry Materials Act** is required. Release from environmental assessment does not guarantee approval.
- 7.2 The site plan (or development plan) to be submitted to the Mineral Lands Division prior to authorization of the quarry must reflect an updated buffer width of a minimum 15 metres.
- 7.3 The Licence to Occupy (159322) does not convey exclusive use of the access road and the Proponent is not to restrict or prevent use of the access road.
- 7.4 Proponent is advised the Project is located in the service area of Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro and to contact Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro regarding potential interactions of the Project with existing or planned electrical infrastructure. ## 8 Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC)

- 8.1 ECCC recommends the Proponent to develop the following plans:
- a management plan that includes appropriate preventive measures to minimize the risk of impacts on migratory birds;
  - an oil spill prevention and response plan; and
  - a contingency plan that considers potential accidents and malfunctions that take into account site-specific conditions and sensitivities.

- 8.2 ECCC further advises that in order to avoid nest destruction and to accommodate the breeding season of migratory birds, operations should consider nesting locations between April 15 and August 15 in this region. ECCC requests that species-at-risk sightings be reported to the Canadian Wildlife Service (CWS) at [ec.scfatldonneesei-cwsatliadata.ec@ec.gc.ca](mailto:ec.scfatldonneesei-cwsatliadata.ec@ec.gc.ca).
