Regulatory and Technical Advice from Government Departments/Divisions

EA #: 2348 - Long Harbour Quarry (the Project)
Anytime Heavy Haul Inc. (the Proponent)

1 Climate Change Branch (CCB), Department of Environment and Climate Change (ECC)

- 1.1 Proponent is advised to consider provincial climate change projections for Argentia (nearest regional site) in Project planning.
- 1.2 Proponent is advised to operate heavy equipment in a manner to maximize fuel efficiency, thereby reducing greenhouse gas emissions that could contribute to climate change. For further information, please contact the CCB at (709) 729-1485.

2 Pollution Prevention Division (PPD), ECC

- 2.1 Proponent is advised that all waste material generated on site shall be removed and disposed of at an approved waste disposal facility.
- 2.2 Registration is required for fuel storage tank systems other than those connected to a heating appliance of a capacity of 2,500 litres or less and may be required for devices or tanks used to separate and remove oily wastes from oil and water mixtures. 3 Water Resources Management Division (WRMD), ECC

- 3.1 Proponent is advised to apply for and obtain a Water Use License under the **Water Resources Act** prior to the start of construction.
- 3.2 Proponent is advised any effluent or runoff leaving the site will be required to conform to the requirements of the Environmental Control Water and Sewage Regulations.
- 3.3 Proponent is advised to contact Vale Base Metals regarding any potential requirements near the Vale Inco hydromet facility.
- 3.4 Proponent is advised to obtain a Section 48 Permit under the **Water Resources Act** should proposed potential settling pond meet the definition of a dam or very small dam. For further information, please contact the WRMD at (709) 729-2563.

4 Government Service Centre (GSC), Department of Digital Government and Service NL (DGSNL)

- 4.1 The Proponent is advised to consider developing a contingency plan specific to the proposed undertaking to enable a quick and effective response to a spill event. Any spill or leak of gasoline or associate product is to be reported immediately to DGSNL by calling the Environmental Emergencies Telephone Line at 772-2083 or 1-800-563-9089.

- 4.2 Any proposed fuel cache will require approval by DGSNL prior to installation. For further information, please contact the GSC at (709) 729-2008.

5 Occupational Health and Safety (OHS), DGSNL

- 5.1 Proponent is advised to ensure that activities are conducted in compliance with the **Occupational Health and Safety Act** and related regulations. This includes the responsibility for ensuring that contractors hired to perform work also comply with the legislation. For further information, contact OHS at (709) 729-3275.

6 Department of Fisheries, Forestry and Agriculture (FFA)

- 6.1 Proponent is advised to operate under the **Wild Life Act** and **Migratory Birds Convention Act** and associated regulations to avoid or minimize adverse impacts.
- 6.2 Proponent is advised to adhere to Section 3 of the Timber Cutting Regulations under the **Forestry Act**. A Cutting Permit is required prior to any harvesting or timber removal in the area.
- 6.3 The Proponent is advised an Operating Permit is required under Section 13 of the Forest Fire Regulations prior to the start of any work during the forest fire season and a Permit to Burn is required under Section 3 of the Forest Fire Regulations to ignite a fire on or within 300 metres of forested land during the forest fire season.
- 6.4 Proponent is advised a Licence to Construct and maintain an access road on Crown Lands is required under Section 6 of the **Lands Act**. For more information on the Crown Lands process, please contact the Crown Lands Inquiry Line at 1-833-891-3249 or email CrownLandsInfo@gov.nl.ca.
- 6.5 Proponent is advised Project location is within Cottage Development Area 19-99-E (Eastern Region Cottage Development Freeze). The proponent is advised to keep noise levels to a minimum and to keep the safety of any potential future cottage owners and recreational users in mind during quarry activities.
- 6.6 Proponent is advised that several species are currently being assessed for designation and listing under the **Newfoundland and Labrador Endangered Species Act (NLESA)** and the federal **Species at Risk Act (SARA)**. The Proponent should be aware that if species that are designated and listed under endangered species legislation are found within the Project area, the **NLESA** and/or the federal **SARA** will apply and the Proponent may be required to develop mitigations, in consultation with FFA-Wildlife Division, for the protection and recovery of the species. 7 Department of Industry, Energy and Technology

- 7.1 Proponent is advised that a quarry permit/lease is required under the **Quarry Materials Act**, 1998, prior to commencement of Project, and a release from further environmental assessment does not guarantee that a quarry permit would

be issued to enable the Project to proceed. Further, IET may require the Proponent to submit additional information in support of the application. For further information concerning this response, please contact the Mines Branch of IET at (709) 729-5748.

8 Department of Municipal and Provincial Affairs (MAPA)

- 8.1 The Proponent is required to submit a discretionary use application to the Town of Long Harbour–Mount Arlington Heights and obtain a Development Approval and Permit prior to commencement of the Project. For further information, please contact MAPA at (709) 729-3090.

9 Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC)

- 9.1 ECCC advises that in order to avoid nest destruction and to accommodate the breeding season of migratory birds, operations should consider nesting locations between mid-April and Mid-August in this region. ECCC requests that species at risk sighting be reported to the Canadian Wildlife Service (CWS) at <http://www.accdc.com/en/contribute.html>.
- 9.2 Proponent is advised to develop the following plans:
- A Contingency Plan that considers potential accidents and malfunctions, and site-specific conditions and sensitivities.
 - An Oil Spill Prevention and Response Plan.
 - A Wildlife Emergency Response Plan.
- 9.3 Proponent is advised to develop and implement measures to diminish the risk of introducing invasive species. For further information, please contact ECCC at (709) 772-4313.
