

Newfoundland Volunteer War Service Medal

General Information

The Newfoundland Volunteer War Service Medal Act, 1993 authorizes the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador to issue medals to those:

1. Who volunteered and served in units or organizations raised or maintained as the contribution of the Dominion of Newfoundland to the allied war effort, namely, the British Imperial Forces, the Newfoundland Overseas Forestry Unit, the merchant navy and the Newfoundland Regiment, or, a unit or organization prescribed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council; and
2. Who is ineligible for or has not received a volunteer war service medal from another country.

An **Application Form** and a **Statutory Declaration Form** must be completed by the appropriate family member. Please forward the completed forms to the address indicated at the top of the Application Form.

Note: Only those relatives listed below **in order of priority** are eligible to be awarded a medal on behalf of a deceased member of his or her family:

- Surviving Spouse
- Eldest Surviving Child
- Eldest Surviving Parent
- Eldest Surviving Brother or Sister

Indicate where you place in the family. If you are in the priority list of eldest surviving brother or sister and are not the eldest, we require a letter from that family member authorizing the release of the medal to you.

Upon receipt of the completed Application Form, Statutory Declaration Form, the appropriate consent letter (if needed), and verification from Veteran's Affairs Canada, the medal will be forwarded.
