

Due to the significant number of serious crane accidents in the past, the Occupational Health and Safety Division has specific regulatory requirements regarding certification of crane operators.

Section 309 states:

An operator of a crane will now be required to have the appropriate trade qualification as determined by the Industrial Training Division by the following dates:

- mobile crane operator, other than a boom truck operator, after January 1, 2011;
- tower crane operator in the construction industry, after January 1, 2011; and
- operator of a boom truck with a rated capacity of more than 10 tonnes, after January 1, 2012.

Crane operators who are not certified after these dates will be in non-compliance with the legislation. To ensure compliance, the Occupational Health and Safety Division recommends that operators commence the certification process early.
