

Selling Tickets Using an Electronic Raffle System

Lottery Licensing Regulations – Schedule D

Section 207(4)(c) of the Criminal Code of Canada prohibits lottery schemes from operating on or through a computer, video device, slot machine or a dice game, except where a computer is used for the sale of a ticket, selection of a winner or the distribution of a prize in a raffle, including a 50/50 draw.

In addition to following all the rules set out in Schedule D for ticket lotteries, if an applicant plans to use an Electronic Raffle System for ticket lotteries, the following information must be disclosed along with the application:

- a. The name of the gaming supplier;
- b. Identification of the platform and technology used to identify the IP address of the purchaser; address of credit card holder; and mailing address of purchaser to limit sales and buyers within the province of Newfoundland and Labrador;
- c. Copies of all online forms, including confirmation of purchase and tickets;
- d. Copy of the supplier contract or agreement, written or verbal, implied or stated, for the gaming supply of purchase of goods or services to confirm compliance with: (i) section 28.(1) of the Lottery Licensing Regulations that requires the method of payment to be pre-determined; (ii) section 28.(2) where the method of payment is percentage based, the percentage shall not exceed 15 percent of gross receipts; and (iii) section 36 which prohibits the conduct and management of a lotteries scheme from being delegated to another organization or to a person who is not a member of the licensed organization;
- e. Confirmation that the platform server is located in Canada;
- f. Confirmation that the online gaming supplier has obtained certification based on the [Policy for Electronic Gaming Equipment Used in an Electronic Raffle](#);
- g. Confirmation that the online gaming supplier is registered through the Registry of Companies to do business in the province;
