

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Future Fund Regulations*.

Definition

2. In these regulations "Act" means the *Future Fund Act*.

Non-renewable resource royalties

3. The portion of non-renewable resource royalties required to be deposited into the fund under paragraph 4(2)(b) of the Act shall be calculated as follows:

- (a) 2% of the amount of non-renewable resource royalties received up to \$250,000,000;
- (b) 5% of the amount of non-renewable resource royalties received that exceeds \$250,000,000 but does not exceed \$500,000,000;
- (c) 10% of the amount of non-renewable resource royalties received that exceeds \$500,000,000 but does not exceed \$1,000,000,000;
- (d) 15% of the amount of non-renewable resource royalties received that exceeds \$1,000,000,000 but does not exceed \$1,500,000,000;
- (e) 25% of the amount of non-renewable resource royalties received that exceeds \$1,500,000,000 but does not exceed \$2,000,000,000;
- (f) 50% of the amount of non-renewable resource royalties received that exceeds \$2,000,000,000 but does not exceed \$2,500,000,000; and
- (g) 75% of the amount of non-renewable resource royalties received that exceeds \$2,500,000,000.

Commencement

4. These regulations come into force on the date the Act comes into force.





(4) Subsection 4(6) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "The baseline emissions intensity of a mobile offshore industrial facility, for the year 2020 and subsequent years" and substituting the words "For the years 2020, 2021 and 2022, the baseline emissions intensity of a mobile offshore industrial facility that commenced production in or before the year 2016".

(5) Section 4 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (6) the following:

(6.1) For the year 2023 and subsequent years, the baseline emissions intensity of a mobile offshore industrial facility that commenced production in or before the year 2016 shall be determined in accordance with the following formula:

$$\text{BEI} = \frac{\text{AE}_{2016} + \text{AE}_{2017} + \text{AE}_{2018}}{\text{HO}_{2016} + \text{HO}_{2017} + \text{HO}_{2018}}$$

where

BEI = baseline emissions intensity for the mobile offshore industrial facility;

AE = the mobile offshore industrial facility's actual emissions of carbon dioxide equivalent of greenhouse gases in a year expressed in tonnes rounded up to the nearest tonne, excluding biomass emissions and any emissions generated from a source category referred to in paragraph 5(1)(j) of the *Management of Greenhouse Gas Reporting Regulations*; and

HO = the mobile offshore industrial facility's hours of operation rounded up to the nearest full hour.

(6) Subsection 4(7) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "or was designated as an opted-in facility after the coming into force of these regulations" and substituting the words "but before the year 2023 or was designated as an opted-in facility after the coming into force of these regulations but before the year 2023".

(7) Section 4 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (7) the following:

(7.1) The baseline emissions intensity of a mobile offshore industrial facility, that commenced production in the year 2023 or a subsequent year or was designated as an opted-in facility in the year 2023 or a subsequent year, shall be determined in accordance with the following formulas:

HO = the mobile offshore industrial facility's hours of operation rounded up to the nearest full hour.

(2) The baseline industrial process emissions intensity of an industrial facility, other than an offshore industrial facility, that commenced production after the year 2016 or was designated as an opted-in facility after the coming into force of this section shall be determined in accordance with the following formulas:

where

$\text{BIPEI}_{\text{yr}4}$ = baseline industrial process emissions intensity for the industrial facility for fourth year of production;

$\text{BIPEI}_{\text{yr}5}$ = baseline industrial process emissions intensity for the industrial facility for fifth year of production;

BIPEI = baseline industrial process emissions intensity for the industrial facility;

AIPE = the industrial facility's actual industrial processes emissions of carbon dioxide equivalent of greenhouse gases in a year expressed in tonnes rounded up to the nearest tonne; and

AP = the industrial facility's actual production in a year rounded up to the nearest tonne.

(3) Notwithstanding subsections (1) and (2), where the industrial facility has an unexpected interruption of production that has a material impact on its production in a year that is to be used to establish the industrial facility's baseline industrial process emissions intensity, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may

- (a) exclude that year from the calculation of the baseline industrial process emissions intensity and calculate the baseline industrial process emissions intensity on fewer years; or
- (b) adjust the AP and AIPE in subsections (1) and (2) on a time denominated basis in a manner that attributes the period of production in a year as if it were a full year.

5. Subsection 5(1) of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

5. (1) Notwithstanding sections 4 and 4.1, an operator may request the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for the baseline emissions intensity or the baseline industrial process emissions intensity or both to be calculated for each product produced at an industrial facility.

- (f) for the year 2024 the greenhouse gas reduction target is 16% below the industrial facility's baseline emissions intensity or baseline emissions level and 0% below the baseline industrial process emissions intensity;
- (g) for the year 2025 the greenhouse gas reduction target is 18% below the industrial facility's baseline emissions intensity or baseline emissions level and 0% below the baseline industrial process emissions intensity;
- (h) for the year 2026 the greenhouse gas reduction target is 20% below the industrial facility's baseline emissions intensity or baseline emissions level and 0% below the baseline industrial process emissions intensity;

- (i) for the year 2027 the greenhouse gas reduction target is 22% below the industrial facility's baseline emissions intensity or baseline emissions level and 0% below the baseline industrial process emissions intensity;
- (j) for the year 2028 the greenhouse gas reduction target is 24% below the industrial facility's baseline emissions intensity or baseline emissions level and 0% below the baseline industrial process emissions intensity;
- (k) for the year 2029 the greenhouse gas reduction target is 26% below the industrial facility's baseline emissions intensity or baseline emissions level and 0% below the baseline industrial process emissions intensity; and
- (l) for the year 2030 and subsequent years the greenhouse gas reduction target is 28% below the industrial facility's baseline emissions intensity or baseline emissions level and 0% below the baseline industrial process emissions intensity.

(2) Subsections 8(2.1) to (4) of the regulations are repealed and the following substituted:

(2.1) Notwithstanding subsection (1), the greenhouse gas reduction target for an industrial facility for which a new baseline emissions intensity or a new baseline industrial process emissions intensity or both was established under paragraph 5.1(3)(b) or a new baseline emissions level was established under paragraph 6.1(3)(b) is set out in Schedule A and for the purposes of this subsection the commencement year in Schedule A shall be considered to be the year in which

- (a) the new baseline emissions intensity or the new baseline industrial process emissions intensity or both was established; or
- (b) the new baseline emissions level was established.

AE = the industrial facility's actual greenhouse gas emissions expressed in tonnes on a carbon dioxide equivalent basis rounded up to the nearest tonne, excluding biomass emissions and any industrial process emissions;

RT_{bipei} = the portion of the industrial facility's greenhouse gas reduction target based on the baseline industrial process emissions intensity calculated in accordance with section 8; and

AIPE = the industrial facility's actual industrial process emissions expressed in tonnes on a carbon dioxide equivalent basis rounded up to the nearest tonne.

(2) Section 10 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (6) the following:

(6.1) Notwithstanding subsection (6), where an offshore industrial facility is ordered by the board to stop production during any period during a year or an offshore industrial facility voluntarily stops production for a period of 31 consecutive days or more during a year, performance credits shall not be issued to the offshore industrial facility for that year.

(6.2) Notwithstanding subsection (6.1), where the offshore industrial facility provides to the minister verified data regarding the offshore industrial facility's actual greenhouse gas emissions during the period in the year that production was not stopped, the minister may

- (a) adjust AE in the calculation in subsection (6) on a time denominated basis in a manner that attributes the period of emissions in a year as if it were a full year;
- (b) use the adjusted AE in the formula in subsection (6) to determine the number of performance credits to be issued to the offshore industrial facility for the year; and
- (c) issue the performance credits to the offshore industrial facility for the year.

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Provincial Health Authority Regulations*.

Definitions

2. (1) In these regulations

(a) "Act" means the *Provincial Health Authority Act*;

(b) "member" means a person appointed to a regional health council; and

(c) "Standards for Management Information Systems in Canadian Health Service Organizations" means the standards for managing financial and statistical data developed and maintained by the Canadian Institute for Health Information and includes all amendments and revisions made to those standards.

(2) For the purposes of the Act and these regulations

(a) "health and community services" means services in the following areas:

(i) health protection and promotion,

(ii) continuing and long term care,

(iii) community health,

(iv) mental health,

(v) addiction services,

(vi) community supports and home care,

(vii) treatment of illness and injury,

(viii) hospital care,

(ix) evaluation, research and quality assurance,

(x) health screening,

(xi) adults in need of protective intervention, and

(xii) road ambulance services; and

(b) "health service provider" means a person, including a corporation, that is employed by, contracted by, affiliated with or holds privileges with the authority for the purposes of providing health care on behalf of the authority, and includes persons licensed or registered to provide health care under an Act of the province.

Board of trustees

3. (1) For the purposes of subsection 11(3) of the Act, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council shall appoint not less than 8 and not more than 18 trustees to the board.

(2) Employees and medical staff of the authority are not eligible to be appointed as trustees.

Responsibilities of the authority

4. The authority shall supervise, direct and control the delivery of health and community services.

Financial records and accounting

5. (1) The financial records of the authority shall be prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

(2) Financial and statistical reporting by the authority shall be in accordance with the Standards for Management Information Systems in Canadian Health Service Organizations and in accordance with any other reporting guidelines or standards which may be required by the minister.

Health regions

6. The province shall be divided into 5 health regions as follows:

(a) Region 1 which extends from the Town of Conception Bay South inclusive in the west and the Town of Witless Bay inclusive in the southeast to the Town of Pouch Cove inclusive in the north, but does not include Bell Island;

(b) Region 2 which consists of the portion of the Avalon Peninsula that is not included in Region 1, Bell Island and the Bonavista and Burin Peninsulas extending to Port Blandford inclusive;

(c) Region 3 which extends from Charlottetown inclusive in the east, Fogo Island in the northeast, Harbour Breton/the

Connagre Peninsula in the south to the Baie Verte Peninsula in the west;

- (d) Region 4 which extends from Port aux Basques on the southwest coast to Francois, northwest to Bartlett's Harbour inclusive and on the eastern boundary north to Jackson's Arm inclusive; and
- (e) Region 5 which consists of the area north of Bartlett's Harbour and north of Englee inclusive on the Northern Peninsula and all of Labrador.

Regional health councils

7. (1) The following regional health councils are established:

- (a) Region 1 Health Council;
- (b) Region 2 Health Council;
- (c) Region 3 Health Council;
- (d) Region 4 Health Council; and
- (e) Region 5 Health Council.

(2) The minister shall appoint not less than 5 members and not more than 15 members to each regional health council.

(3) The minister shall appoint a chairperson for each regional health council.

(4) For the purpose of subsection (3), the chairperson of a regional health council shall be appointed from the members appointed to that regional health council under subsection (2).

(5) The members shall be appointed for a term of 3 years and may be reappointed for one further term of 3 years.

(6) Where a member of a regional health council resigns from or becomes unable to carry out the member's duties and responsibilities, the minister shall appoint a person to replace the member for the remainder of the member's term.

(7) Where the term of a member of a regional health council expires, the member continues to be a member until reappointed or replaced.


Delegation **8.** (1) The minister may delegate to the authority the minister's power to appoint an inspector under paragraph 2(c) of the *Health and Community Services Act*, for the purpose of the *Personal Care Home Regulations* made under that Act only.

(2) A delegation referred to in subsection (1) shall be in writing.

9. The *Regional Health Authorities Regulations*, Newfoundland and Labrador Regulation 18/08, are repealed.

Commencement **10. These regulations come into force on the date the Act comes into force.**



1. This Order may be cited as the *Black Bear Hunting and Trapping Order, Newfoundland and Labrador*.

Devices permitted

2. (1) Only Aldrich foot snares or similar foot holding devices may be set for the taking of black bears and those devices shall be set in a covered "cubby set" and clearly marked with a warning sign indicating that a bear trapping device is set in the "cubby".

(2) A person who sets a device referred to in subsection (1) shall check it daily.

Prohibited devices

3. Steel-jaw leghold, spring or jump traps or neck snares shall not be used to take black bears.

Special licence

4. Persons who have resided in the electoral district of Torngat Mountains for a period of 6 consecutive months immediately before applying for a licence may be issued a licence identified as a special licence free of charge.

Bag limit


5. (1) The bag limit shall be 2 black bear of any age or sex per licence.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), female black bears accompanied by cubs shall not be taken by shooting.

Repeal

6. The *Black Bear Hunting and Snaring Order, Newfoundland and Labrador*, Newfoundland and Labrador Regulation 68/18, is repealed.

6. The open season for the trapping and shooting of black bear in Labrador, excluding Torngat Mountains National Park and Mealy Mountains National Park Reserve, shall be April 1, 2023 to July 13, 2023 and August 10, 2023 to November 30, 2023.

2. Subsections 7(2) to (4) of the Order are repealed and the following substituted:

(2) The open season for the trapping and shooting of black bear on the Island of Newfoundland in all moose management areas shall be May 1, 2023 to July 15, 2023 and September 9, 2023 to November 12, 2023.

(3) Notwithstanding subsection (2), there shall be no open season for the trapping or shooting of black bear in moose management areas 31 to 36, 43 and 44.

(4) The open season for the shooting of black bear on the Island of Newfoundland in all moose management areas by long bow or compound bow and arrow shall be August 26, 2023 to September 8, 2023.
