**To:** All Municipalities and Local Service Districts, Inuit Community Governments, and Consultants  
**Re:** Intake for Federal Funding Program – Active Transportation Fund  
**Date:** January 15, 2025

---

This circular aims to inform local governments about a funding opportunity from the Government of Canada.

The Department of Housing, Infrastructure and Communities Canada (HICC) has announced the launch of new capital project intake under the **Active Transportation Fund**. This new intake supports the development and enhancement of active transportation networks to provide safe and affordable active modes of transportation.

HICC understands the importance of shortening commute times for families, creating employment opportunities and promoting healthier lifestyles. To this end, funding will be provided to capital projects that involve new construction or enhancement of existing infrastructure that encourage travel by active methods, including sidewalks, multi-use paths and bike lanes.

Applications are currently being accepted through HICC's [Applicant Portal](#) **until 7:00pm (Eastern) on February 26, 2025, while applications from eligible Indigenous applicants will continue to be accepted until 7:00pm (Eastern) on April 9, 2025.**
